Are you able to spare 4-5 hours a month? The Governors at Marlborough St Marys Primary School are always interested in applications from those interested in supporting our school to flourish.

School Governors are volunteers, and the role offers an interesting opportunity to share your experiences & knowledge to the benefit of the school. Governors are expected to attend six full governing body meetings each year which meet in the evenings and serve on a committee which also meet six times a year during the school day. To be an effective governor, you will also need to set aside time: to prepare for meetings, to visit the school, to undertake training and update your knowledge. A comprehensive range of training will be on offer to support you.

Governors sit on one of two committees, Finances and Resources (FRC) or Teaching and Learning (TLC) and experience in or any of the following skills would be useful:

Finances and Resources Committee: Finance & Accountancy, Business or Legal, HR & Staffing or Health & Safety.

Teaching and Learning Committee: An interest in championing the Curriculum, Special Educational Needs & Disability, Disadvantaged Learners or Safeguarding. A background in education or social care is useful but not essential.
